**Integrated ELD-** Teachers providing language acquisition support during regular content area lessons. (**ALL DAY ALL Subjects**)

**Designated ELD-** Provided during protected time during the school day to develop English language proficiency

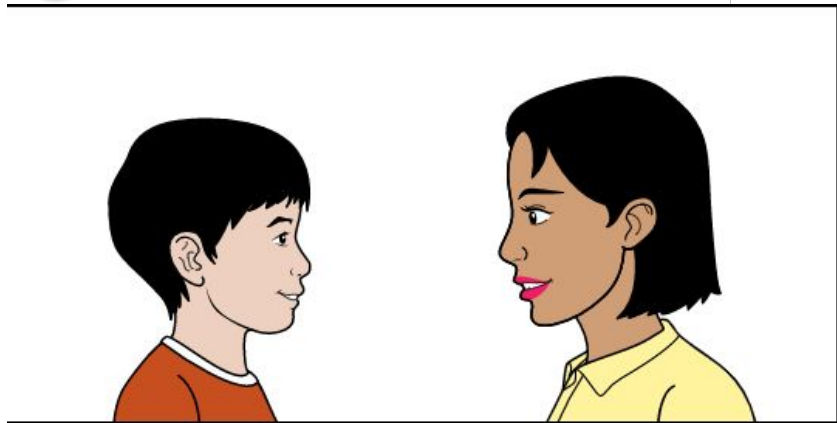
## ELPAC (English Language Proficiency Assessment for California)

<b>WHO</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Students who have a primary language other than English</li><li>• NEVER Been Classified as English Learner</li></ul>	<b>WHO</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• ALL Students Identified as English Learners (ELs)</li></ul>
<b>WHAT</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Initial ELPAC is used to Identify a student as either an English Learner or Proficient in English</li></ul>	<b>WHAT</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Used to measure the skills of ELs and determine if ready for Reclassification</li></ul>
<b>WHEN</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Within 30 days of enrollment</li></ul>	<b>WHEN</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Every Spring (Feb. and March) until they are Reclassified</li></ul>
<b>WHY</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Identify students who need support in their English Development</li></ul>	<b>WHY</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Measure their progress in learning English</li></ul>

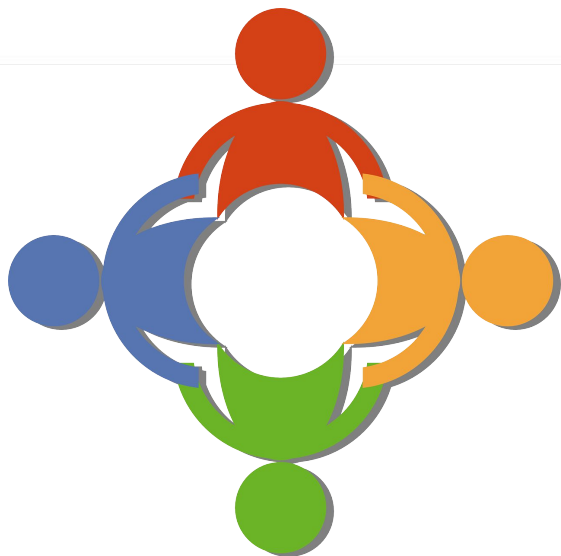
