Child Care Services \$100 M

- Funding is part of SB 89, emergency legislation to provide up to \$1 billion in funding to help California fight the COVID-19 pandemic <u>https://www.gov.ca.gov/2020/04/10/governor-newsom-announces-release-of-100-</u> million-to-support-child-care-services-for-essential-workers-and-vulnerable-populations/
 - Governor Gavin Newsom, on April 7, 2020, announced release of \$100 million to support child care services, and to support child care providers who are stepping up to serve essential infrastructure workers and vulnerable populations and their children during this critical time.
 - \$50 million will go to the California Department of Education to be used to pay for up to 20,000 limited-term additional state-subsidized slots for child care.
 - \$50 million to the Department to ensure child care centers, facilities and family provider homes are safe and clean by reimbursing them for the purchase of gloves, face coverings, cleaning supplies, and other labor related to cleaning

Food and Nutrition

 On March 25th the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA's) Food and Nutrition Service issued a new <u>nationwide waiver</u> clarifying its policies on picking up free school meals to-go during the COVID-19 pandemic. Under USDA's initial waiver allowing school to distribute meals to-go to eligible children, the children themselves were required to be present in order for meal pickup. This waiver changes that policy and allows for parents or guardians to pick up their eligible child's meals, without the child being present, effective through the end of June.
